Superintendent Report

December 23th , 2019

Community:

The Tire Grant cleanup program ended December 1st with a total count of 1,278 tires turned in. I have been getting positive comments that we are not seeing them left in right of ways, or dumped on rural private property as had been happening in the past. We are on track for next year to participate again.

DPW:

I have received 4 applications for part time Custodian. I hope to meet with the personel committee next week. Bill Baily will be on medical leave for a while. Guy would like to meet with the Committee as well to discuss the choice for Custodian; if they are qualified there may be some need to assist the DPW until Bill is fully back to work.

Code Enforcement:

I will be meeting with Deputy Chris Kuenzer on December 26th and he will be starting on January 6th . I have set up a work station and will be getting him a log on to the BS&A building department software.

IT Committee:

With the Committee recommending Teck Solutions; I will be meeting with them to discuss the specifications for hardware upgrades.

Additional:

- Coleman Engineering has just submitted a proposal to host the GIS system. We are hosted on Norway's server, and this arrangement is expiring, and changes they are making will not make it available. Initial discussion was that the cost would be the same.
- Reminder MTA conference is April 27 – 30th.
- MML Liability policy has been received and is on file.
- Please refer to your email update on the status of the Assessing Dept. I have contacted the Michigan Treasurer's office and will be submitting a letter to them. They indicated that they will work with us, and were pleased to see we were taking steps to address any work that needs to be done.
